Bear Lake Trail: Open, trail is brushy

Clear Creek Trail: West Fork to Creek is cleared

Cold Springs: Open

Cooking Green Pass: Open to Seiad, no stock on trail

Elbow Springs: Open, creek is high but crossing is do-able for experienced hikers

Elk Creek Trail: Open to Blue, Green, Gold Granite Lakes and a little bit beyond.

Fort Goff: Open

Granite Creek Trail: Open, expect some snow on trail

Grider Creek PCT: Open to Devil's Peak (Not recommended for animals)

Johnson's Hunting Ground: Open

Kelly Lake: Open

Kelsey Trail: Open from Elbow Springs. Is good to Bear Lake Junction and West Fork Junction. Kelsey to Red Hill Junction is covered with brush and rocks, not recommended for livestock.

No Mans: Open

Norcross Trailhead: Open

Poker Flat to Young's Valley: Open to Kelly Lake and The Lieutenants

Ukonom/Cuddihy Lakes: Open

Carter Meadows, including Trail Gulch, Long Gulch and Fish Lake: Open

Coffee Creek and Caribou Lakes: Open at trail head to lower Caribou Lake and Upper Caribou lake. Not passable for stock

Paradise: Accessible via Canyon Creek on Roads 41 and 44. Water crossing is high, but do-able.

Paynes Lake: Open

Ridgeline: Fully open, but use extreme driving skills reaching trailhead.

Road Report Klamath National Forest

Grayback 48 Road: Open

Kelly Lake 18N30: Open

Poker Flat 18N30: Open

Mt Ashland Area

Road 22: Open and snow free the entire distance

Road 20 at Long John Saddle (20/22): Snow free approximately 3 miles to the east and 3.5 miles to the west, then still some large drifts just east of Jackson Gap

Road 20 at Mt Ashland: You can now drive to Grouse Gap Shelter, however Road 20 is blocked by snow about 1/2 mile to the west of Grouse Gap. It will be at least Aug 1 before the biggest drifts melt out at Willamette Meridian and below Dutchman Peak between Jackson Gap and the 20-805 spur.

2080: Open and snow free the entire distance

Pacific Crest Trail: Snow is still melting and some parts of the trail are clear. Check with the local USDA Forest Service office for up to date information.
